### Fall 2005 "Get Ready for a Finger Lickin' Good Time"

**September 17th: Day Climbing Trip or Day Hiking Trip (two different trips) (\$10 price for everyone)**

A short day trip for anyone that wants to go hiking around the Rocky Mountain National Park area or go climbing in the beautiful Castlewood Canyon. Open to all skill levels and any necessary equipment will be provided.

**September 24-25: Overnight Backpacking Trip (\$20 members/ \$25 non-members)**

Get out and experience a part of Colorado while backpacking into a remote campsite. The trip will be a single night, with a moderate backpacking amount. All food and equipment will be provided.

**September 26 (Monday): Matchstick Productions Ski Film "The Hit List" (\$TBD, member discount)**

Come see one of the sickest ski movies of the year at the Gothic Theater. Doors open at 7:00pm and film starts at 8:00pm. Tickets available at discount to Club members; other benefits to follow, keep posted.

**October 1-2: Multi-pitch Clinic with the Colorado Mountain School (\$140 members/ \$160 non-members)**

Professional guides will teach you how to properly set-up climbing anchors, place trad placements, and help with climbing techniques. Then on Sunday you will be climbing one of the classic multi-pitch trad routes in the infamous Eldorado Canyon.

**October 5 (Wednesday): Teton Gravity Research Film "The Tangerine Dream" (\$TBD, member discount)**

This film outlines the legendary film company from the very start to becoming one of the largest extreme sports film companies around. At the Gothic theater, doors open at 7:00pm. Keep posted for updates.

**October 7-9: Climb, Bike and Hike in Moab, Utah (\$35 members/ \$40 non-members)**

This amazing trip takes a large group of DUAC'ers to the beautiful Moab to either rock climb, mountain bike, road bike, or hike. Multiple skill level trips will be taken and no-one should miss this adventure.

**October 15: Day Mountain Biking Trip or Day Fly-Fishing Trip (\$10 members/\$15 non-members)**

Take a day to go mountain biking in one of the beautiful trails that line the front-range area or go fishing on one of the numerous rivers that run through Colorado. Bike/Fishing equipment will not be provided and it is open to all skill levels. These are two separate trips happening on the same day.

**October 21-23: Hike a 14'er and then Play in the Sanddunes (\$25 members/ \$30 non-members)**

Get the chance to see the world from 14,000ft on one of Colorado's infamous peaks and then play in the sand the next day at Sanddunes National Park.

**October 29-30: Shelf Road Climbing Trip (\$25 members/ \$30 non-members)**

It remains hot in Canon City year around, which makes this time perfect to go climb some unique limestone in Colorado. Any climbing equipment you need will be provided.

### **January 7: Beginner Ski/Snowboard Trip Sponsored by the Kathryn Ellington Memorial Fund (\$40 Members/ \$50 non-members)**

A trip for all the beginner’s out there that will include professional lessons, equipment rental, and transportation at the Loveland Ski Resort. Limited spots for both skiers and boarders.

### **January 13-16: Jackson Hole Extended Weekend ski/ride trip (Friday - Monday Night) (\$140 members/ \$160 non-members)**
